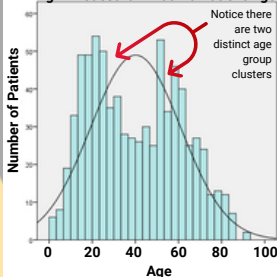
Differences among Injured Pedestrians using Measures of Community Need

Nevada Trauma Center Pedestrian Patient Demographics

772 pedestrian patients
2015-2017

- 63.1% Male
- 61.7% White
- Median age: 38 years

Call to Action

Pedestrians are our most vulnerable of road users, and this analysis indicates they are also disadvantaged economically. We must do more to ensure the safety of all Nevadans via education, engineering, enforcement, and emergency medical services.

Fig 2. Median Household Income Ratio

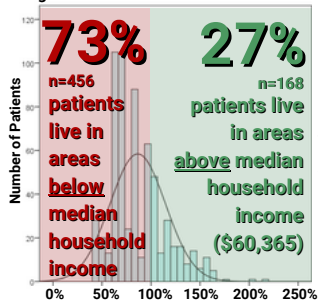
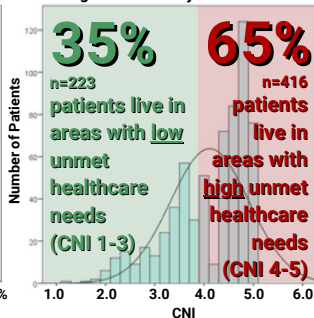


Fig 3. Community Needs Index



Measurements of Need



- Community Needs Index (CNI) represents a community's unmet healthcare needs. CNI scores are based on ZIP codes and range from 1-5, with higher scores indicating greater need.
- Pedestrian trauma patients more frequently live in areas **below** Nevada's median household income, and reside in areas with **higher** CNI scores.

Patient Outcomes

- 28.1% of pedestrians were severely injured
- Almost 12% of patients died
- Median hospital charges were \$61K

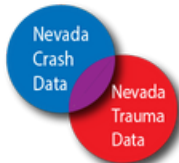
