Data Update

Traffic Records Coordinating Committee (TRCC) (Chair: Kevin Tice, DPS-OTS)

- NDOT is updating their crash data system with Timmons group, transfer of crash data to bypass EITS and go directly to NDOT.
- New geolocating process for electronic data that will speed up crash data availability.
- Matt Williams has been elected as the vice-chair for TRCC.
- Next meeting is on December 13 at 1:30 PM.

Nevada Advisory Committee on Traffic Safety (NVACTS) Update:

- NVACTS met on Thursday, September 8, and heard a presentation from Michael Scott Davidson from the Las Vegas Review Journal about the article they ran regarding the lack of accountability due to citations from dangerous driving.
- Two working groups were established, one to support traffic safety policy priorities and plan for the 2023 Legislative Session and one to track the citation process.
- The next NVACTS meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 8.

NDOT Update

- Publishing the Speed Management Action Plan soon. Starting the first Local Road Safety Plan in Nevada for City of North Las Vegas, others coming soon. Two Safety Management Plans (SMPs) are underway.

OTS Update

- Projects are underway for the year, focusing on speed and behavioral. OTS is preparing the next grant application season. Letters of Interest (LOIs) are due in February.

Plans, Strategies and Action Item Updates (see attached)

- Occupant Protection (Vice Chair: Laura Gryder-Culver):
 - New CPS language, Erin Breen reaching out to Assemblywoman Bilbray-Axelrod.
 - Not planning to pursue a primary seat belt law for 2023.
 - Upcoming “Click It or Ticket” events Nov 10-30 and May 13-31. Joining Forces events are scheduled for about one per month, and run about 2-3 weeks.
 - **Action:** track outcomes of Joining Forces events.
- Older Driver (Vice Chair: Xochitl Kambak):
 - Working with action step leaders and others to initiate action steps and gather best practices. There are services available for older drivers, working on communications and distributing information.
 - Action: If you would like to volunteer for one or more of the Action Steps under Older Drivers, please contact Lindsay (lindsay.saner@kimley-horn.com)
- Young Drivers (Vice Chair: Nick Nordyke):
 - Graduated Driver’s License (GDL) additions for cell phone use, intermediate licensing and primary seat belt are all being considered for 2023 Legislative Session, looking for a sponsor/BDR.
 - Currently updating the website and outreach for Zero Teen Fatalities (ZTF).
 - ZTF team conducting ZTF outreach events with tribal communities (1/17 Indian Springs, upcoming Pyramid Lake High School)
 - Drivers Edge event in December, about 600 on the waiting list. More events planned for 2023.
 - Proper education for new drivers, should require (in person) coursework and certificate to take the test for a permit.
 - **Action:** research driver’s education and permit/licensing process in other states
