- Traffic Records Coordinating Committee (TRCC) Updates:
 - The next TRCC meeting is December 19.
 - Progress is being made with University of Nevada, Las Vegas on a number of data projects, funded through grants from OTS.
- Agency Updates:
 - Rebecca Kapuler (NDOT) announced that 1,000 reflective beanies (hats) have been ordered, and will be distributed at a Safe Routes to School event in Southern Nevada and at a future event in Northern Nevada.
 - Erin Breen announced that there is a "pledge to drive so others survive." Visit <u>pedsafe.vegas</u> to take the pledge and be entered into the drawing for prizes.
 - Lacey Tisler (NDOT) announced that the Speed Management Action Plan received an Honorable Mention from the Roadway Safety Foundation. Visit the site here for more info: <u>2023 Honorable</u> <u>Mentions | Roadway Safety Foundation</u>
- Motorcycle Updates:
 - Accident Scene Management (ASM)/Road Guardians provided accident scene management training to 198 people in Nevada (with a goal of 200).
 - Justin McDonald shared that some of the students shared how they used their ASM training in real-life scenarios to provide car at the scene of a crash.
 - Laurie Sanders shared that she will be presenting at a future Confederation of Clubs meeting in January to promote skills training.
- Pedestrian Updates:

General Discussion:

- World Day of Remembrance was held on November 19, with an event at the Las Vegas Little Theater.
 World Day of Remembrance 2023 PedSAFE. The event was held the day after the Formula 1 event in Las Vegas. The group discussed coordinating with the Formula 1 organizers to promote World Day of Remembrance at the event in 2024.
- Attended First Friday event with tables for partners, cross walks, and other road safety tools, reminders, and give aways.
- Nevada Moves Day will be the last week of March. It will be the 14th year for Nevada Moves Day, where kids are encouraged to walk or bike to and from school.

- It was noted that using the acronym "VRU" when speaking about pedestrians and bicyclists on our roadways takes away the human factor of those dying in traffic crashes.


