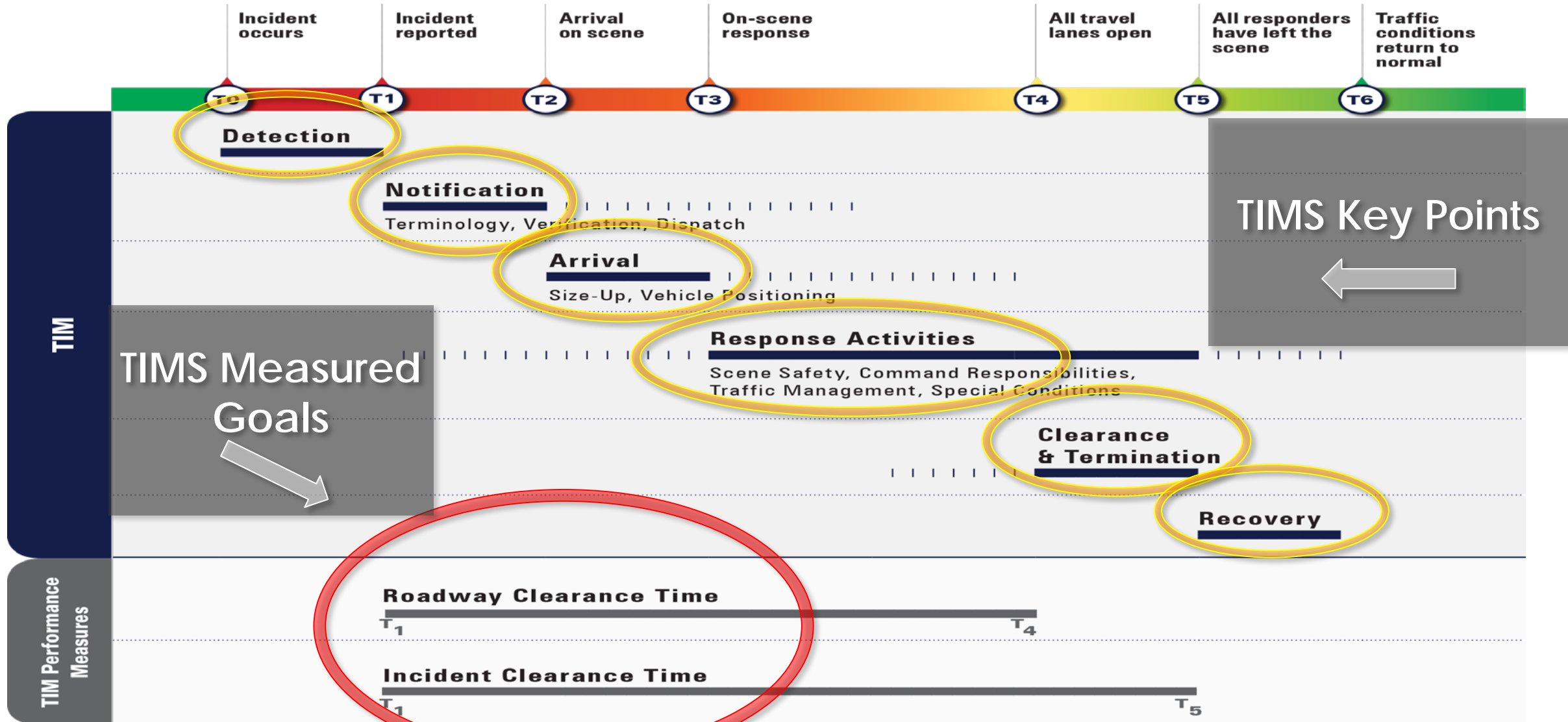
Designed to establish the foundation for and promote consistent training of all responders to achieve the three objectives of the TIM National Unified Goal (NUG):

NRS 484C.430

Penalty if death or substantial bodily harm results; exception; segregation of offender; plea bargaining restricted; suspension of sentence and probation prohibited; affirmative defense; exception; aggravating factor. [Effective until the date of the repeal of the federal law requiring each state to make it unlawful for a person to operate a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or greater as a condition to receiving federal funding for the construction of highways in this State.]



NRS 484C.430 (cont'd)

1. Unless a greater penalty is provided pursuant to [NRS 484C.440\[leg.state.nv.us\]](https://leg.state.nv.us/nrs/nrs_484.html#NRS484C.440), a person who:
 - (a) Is under the influence of intoxicating liquor;
 - (b) Has a concentration of alcohol of 0.08 or more in his or her blood or breath;
 - (c) Is found by measurement within 2 hours after driving or being in actual physical control of a vehicle to have a concentration of alcohol of 0.08 or more in his or her blood or breath;
 - (d) Is under the influence of a controlled substance or is under the combined influence of intoxicating liquor and a controlled substance;
 - (e) Inhales, ingests, applies or otherwise uses any chemical, poison or organic solvent, or any compound or combination of any of these, to a degree which renders the person incapable of safely driving or exercising actual physical control of a vehicle; or



NRS 484C.110 (cont'd)

(f) Has a prohibited substance in his or her blood or urine, as applicable, in an amount that is equal to or greater than the amount set forth in subsection 3 or 4 of [NRS 484C.110\[leg.state.nv.us\]](https://leg.state.nv.us),

and does any act or neglects any duty imposed by law while driving or in actual physical control of any vehicle on or off the highways of this State, if the act or neglect of duty proximately causes the death of, or substantial bodily harm to, another person, is guilty of a category B felony and shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 2 years and a maximum term of not more than 20 years and must be further punished by a fine of not less than \$2,000 nor more than \$5,000. A person so imprisoned must, insofar as practicable, be segregated from offenders whose crimes were violent and, insofar as practicable, be assigned to an institution or facility of minimum security.

2. A prosecuting attorney shall not dismiss a charge of violating the provisions of subsection 1 in exchange for a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to a lesser charge or for any other reason unless the attorney knows or it is obvious that the charge is not supported by probable cause or cannot be proved at the time of trial. A sentence imposed pursuant to subsection 1 may not be suspended nor may probation be granted.



MCI Demonstration Scenario

Location – Interstate 15 SB @ Spring Mtn. Blvd. overpass (40' drop on street side of freeway).

Details – Weather is dry, road is dry, time of day is: afternoon.

Vehicle #1 – vehicle came to rest with passenger against the jersey wall (simulated by water barriers). Driver is suspected DUI while the passenger is a fatality.

Vehicle #2 – Suddenly has to stop as crash is in front of them.

Vehicle #3 – Suddenly has to stop as crash is in front of them.

Vehicle #4 – is a box van who suddenly stops and rolls upon Vehicle #2 & #3. This will lead to a Hazmat issue.



MCI Demonstration Scenario (cont'd)

Injuries – there are multiple injuries in multiple vehicles.

Extrication – needed for fatality, other vehicles

1st Responders – will be staged at another location to simulate responding to the MCI incident.

Actors – there will be EMS volunteers that will be made up to depict injuries as well as being witnesses to the accident.

There will be multiple disciplines involved in this demonstration. Many of our partners have offered their time, skills, and talents to the instructing of the TIMS 4 hour class as well as to the MCI demonstration. 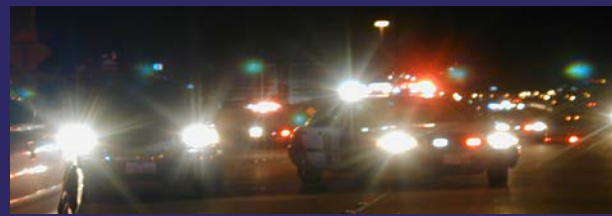
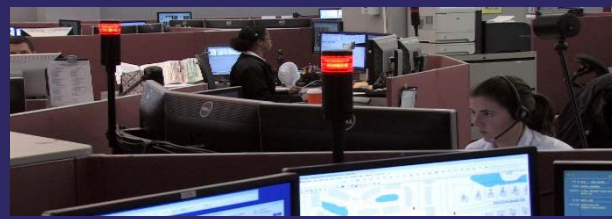
